OVERVIEW

NOA-Networks Overcoming Antisemitism is a unique project which monitors what countries in Europe are doing to counter antisemitism and foster Jewish life through their government institutions.

In direct response to the 2018 European Council's Declaration for Member States to adopt a holistic strategy to fight antisemitism, NOA provides a framework for the development and implementation of national action plans.

The first phase of NOA (2020-2023) covered five countries – Austria, Belgium, Hungary, Italy, and the Netherlands. The flagship activity was the publication of National Report Cards which are intended to benchmark Member States' progress over time.

NOA offers a wealth of cultural-educational resources that can help reverse the tide of antisemitic attitudes, including: equipping educators with training and teaching tools; mapping efforts to combat antisemitism; diffusing positive narratives through socio-cultural educational activities; and garnering commitments from sporting authorities for the creation of inclusive environments.

A second phase of the NOA project began in May 2024 and includes research and programming in Estonia and Spain.

NATIONAL REPORT CARDS

NOA's flagship activity is the development of National Report Cards, which provide a nuanced holistic snapshot of EU Member States' policies across 11 areas. Phase 1 covered five countries and the published reports serve as substantial resources and benchmarking tools, helping Member States to develop and implement national action plans.
